**“The Implications of 30-Year Demographic Change on Disease Prevention and Health Promotion Strategies”**

In the past thirty years, changes in birth and mortality rates, migration patterns, distribution of socio-determinants of health and the reorganization of health care present a formidable challenge for public health. Over this period of time, the occurrence of severe comorbid chronic diseases and conditions, the burden of injuries and emerging infectious diseases have continued to grow unchallenged among older Missourians. Other segments of the minority populations have continued to suffer disproportionate burden of disease. Partnering with health care and addressing socio-determinants of health while aiming to prevent and control

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precursors of these health problems are some of the possible strategies for public health.
